

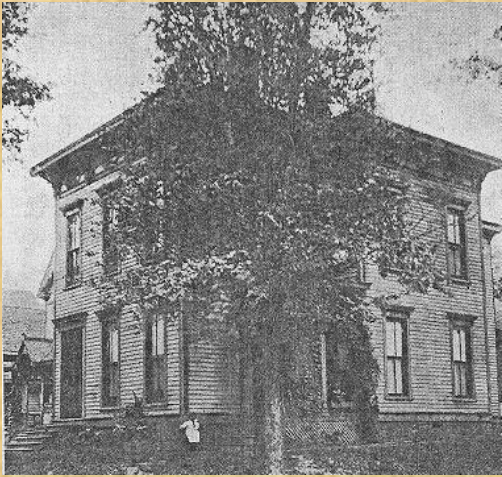
# Lincoln Hospital 1909-1915

In the early years of the twentieth century, the African-American community in Indianapolis faced segregation in most aspects of their lives. For black physicians, discrimination by the medical profession hampered their ability to deliver health care to their patients. This presentation outlines the desire of these doctors to treat their patients with quality care and the strategies they used in their attempt to create a modern hospital.
