Dr. Darin L. Wolfe is a forensic pathologist based out of Bloomington, IN. He is the owner of Indiana Forensic & Surgical Pathology, LLC, through which he performs forensic and medical autopsies all over the state of Indiana. His article *To See For One's Self*, a review on the national decline of autopsies, won a Brooks-Sydney Award from the *New York Times*.
