## New Grave Marker Dedicated at the Central State Hospital Cemetery

On Monday, June 2, Mayor Greg Ballard, City/County Councilor Marilyn Pfisterer, and the Indiana Medical History Museum dedicated a new grave marker in the Central State Hospital Cemetery. The cemetery contains 575 individual graves including two Civil War veterans. The monumental headstone is the result of three years of efforts from people in government, nonprofit (including the Indiana Medical History Museum), and the private sectors. This dedication will help preserve the history of the former Central State Hospital and the dignity of those buried in the cemetery.

The Central State Hospital Cemetery is located on Tibbs Ave., just south of Mount Jackson Cemetery.
