A former licensed practical nurse, Orville Lynn Majors, was nicknamed as the "Angel of Death" during a lengthy investigation and trial which drew world-wide media attention to the Linton, Indiana community. His victims, aged 56 to 89, were said to have been in stable condition before they died suddenly while under Majors's care. One particular patient's demise is the focus of this presentation.
